Gerald Dickens Returns to Riverside

The Riverside Dickens Festival welcomes back to Riverside internationally acclaimed actor, director and producer Gerald Charles Dickens, a great-great grandson of literary master Charles Dickens. In 1993 Gerald Dickens created his first one-man show, a theatrical performance of *A Christmas Carol* inspired by Charles' own energetic readings of the 1860s. A fascination with the life and works of his great-great grandfather, led Gerald to write and direct further one-man shows including *Mr. Dickens is Coming!*, *Nicholas Nickleby* and *Sketches by Boz.* He regularly performs in major theatres and arts centers as well as at hotels and stately homes. He has appeared at arts and literary festivals, schools, colleges and universities both in the UK and the United States, and the Riverside Dickens Festival. He has also been entertaining cruise ship passengers worldwide since 2007.

During his two-day stay in Riverside, Mr. Dickens will perform three works in different venues. Order your tickets early as these events are expected to sell out!



Sikes and Nancy—This is Victorian theater at its most dramatic. Most of Charles Dickens' readings were safe, well-known and often comic passages from his novels, but in 1869 he introduced Sikes and Nancy. When Dickens performed what he called "The Murder" he judged the success of the evening by the number of ladies who had fainted with horror. Today it has lost none of its power. A Christmas Carol—Dickens' beloved and heartwarming story of redemption has defined how Christmas is celebrated around the world for over 100 years. In Gerald's adaptation of this classic tale he plays over 30 characters using his vocal and physical talents to bring each scene vividly to life. Popular at any time of year, Gerald's performance has received standing ovations all over the world. Luncheon and performance with book signing

Top Hole!—Based on the legendary and much loved golfing stories of PG Wodehouse, the creator of the popular characters Jeeves and Wooster, this clever 2-act play is based on four of the funniest golfing tales written between 1922 and 1937. With full permission of the Wodehouse estate, this performance is the United States premiere of *Top Hole!* Buffet Dinner and performance with book signing.




Non-Fiction


