Meet Mr. Díckens...and Mr. Poe

Thanks to the support and generosity of the Greater Riverside Chambers of Commerce Downtown Business Council and other private donors, Mr. Dickens and Mr. Poe visited several middle schools this past fall and spring providing educational and entertaining literary programs for the students.

Mr. Dickens, portrayed by the talented actor, playwright and college instructor, Paul Jacques, performed his original one-man show, *Meet Mr. Dickens* at Earhart, Central, Gage, Arizona and Loma Vista middle schools. The performance gives students insight into the social, political and personal events that influenced Dickens' writing.

Mr. Poe, portrayed by actor Travis Rhett Wilson, performed at Gage and Arizona middle schools and at John W. North High School. Wilson presented a riveting rendition of Poe's writings including *The Telltale Heart, The Raven* and *Annabelle Lee* for the students.






Community Partnership Program Supports RDF

He was founder and conductor of the Raincross Chorale for 14 years until he retired in 2014. Following John T. Hamilton, Steve directed the Evensong program for the festival for 14 years.




Dickens' sixth novel was published in monthly installments from January 1843 to 1844 after Dickens had taken a year off to visit America for the first time. Dickens believed this to be his greatest novel but it was less than enthusiastically received. The novel deals with the greed of Old Martin's relatives, chiefly, Mr. Pecksniff, hoping to inherit his wealth.







Want to Dress Up for the 2016 Festival? Start now.

Board members are often asked, "Do I have to dress up to come to the Dickens Festival?" The answer is "no", of course; but over the 22 years the festival has been in existence more and more visitors do dress in Victorian attire.

Many people start out trying to achieve the period "look" by purchasing inexpensive clothing items in thrift stores or even checking the back of the closets at home for items that will work. This is a good way to get started, not worrying about authenticity. Authenticity can come later when you purchase an outfit or accessory from one of the London Marketplace vendors during the festival or even start sewing your own clothes or working with a seamstress for tailored more authentic clothes.

In the meantime, you can start now to put together your Victorian outfit for 2016. Here are some ideas from the International Printmaking Museum website that might help you get started.
