Author Spotlight: The Stevenson's a love story

Robert Louis Stevenson met Fanny Van Der Grift Osbourne quite by accident; in a small French art community where he was visiting his cousin, Fanny was studying art with her daughter away from her philandering husband back in America. They immediately hit it off and spent the next two years enjoying each other's company until Fanny decided to return home to her husband so as not to set a bad example for her daughter, for she was still dependent on him for money. Louis was heartbroken and vowed to follow her to America, but his parents disapproved. Fanny being ten years his senior, married, and with children, his parents refused to help him financially. He then spent some time traveling in the South of France, inventing the sleeping bag (or "sleep sack" as he called it) and writing the biographical essay Travels with a Donkey in the Cévennes, one of his earliest published works. He then used the publishing money to sail steerage class to the United States and took a train from New York to San Francisco upon receiving a telegraph from Fanny telling him she intended to leave her husband. Upon arriving on her doorstep unannounced, however, she turned him away. Stevenson, very ill from his stint in steerage class, crawled up the road a few blocks and promptly collapsed at a goat farm. The owners took him in and nursed him back to health. As he recuperated, Fanny finally left her husband. The two were married in San Francisco in 1880 and settled in Monterey, California.

Louis took to suddenly being a father to Fanny's two children quite well. Upon drawing a map with his stepson Lloyd one evening, Stevenson developed the basis for the beloved novel Treasure Island, which made him a great deal of money. The family then moved to London, where Stevenson, in a fevered state of illness, wrote the first draft of The Strange Case of Dr. Jekyll & Mr. Hyde. Upon reading it, Fanny called it a "penny dreadful" and threw the manuscript into the fire. Fanny believed in Louis and knew he could do better. The subsequent drafts (which Fanny edited as she would many of his works over the next ten years) became very popular. When the Jack the Ripper murders happened, sales of Jekyll & Hyde skyrocketed, making Robert Louis Stevenson the most popular author in the world at that time.

Over the rest of Stevenson's lifetime, Fanny was his constant companion and editor as they traveled the world looking for better climates for his health. Fanny also wrote stories of her own, and they even wrote a few together. Eventually settling in Valima, Samoa, and building a home there, Louis succumbed to an

aneurysm; a mere ten years after their marriage. Fanny, despite being ten years his senior, lived to the ripe old age of 74, passing away in 1914. She spent her remaining years championing his work, publishing his letters and travelogues, and speaking at engagements around the world about Louis and his work. She never remarried despite having several suitors, and her ashes were buried alongside Stevenson at his tomb in Samoa.

Together in death, as they were in life.
A true love story for the ages.





Literary Corner: Robert Louis Stevenson's poems to Fanny

Robert Louis Stevenson's poems My Wife, and I Will Make You Brooches can be found in the book titled Songs of Travel and Other Verses published posthumously in 1896.



RLS wrote this poem in 1887 while the couple undertook the building of their home Vailima. He wrote this poem to help Fanny see things more positively while they waited for their home to be completed.


Trusty, dusky, vivid, true,


